Humane Society Police Work Update

We often say that our humane officers work tirelessly to protect the animals of Luzerne County. This is a job with no end and it's never easy. In 2022 some cases were particularly severe. Several involved dozens of animals in need of our help. Investigations led to warrants which led to SPCA vans along with volunteer's trailers filled with animals being brought to our shelter. It is important to note, that each of our cases start with a concerned phone call to our humane officers. If you see something, please say something. Here are some quick updates on some of our biggest cases this year.



July Cows

It was a hot day at the end of June and our Humane Society Police Officers were called to meet the State Police at a local farm. When they arrived, they found over 30 young calves in desperate need of help. Within the next 24 hours, the animals were transported by multiple volunteers with their trailers to the large dog runs behind the shelter. All were checked by a veterinarian, medications, fluids and specialized food were all started. Generators were needed to run the cooling fans, along with a seemingly endless supply of bottles, milk replacement, hay, and even Gatorade. How were we able to respond so quickly? Our community gives us the volunteer manpower and financial support we need to make a difference in these animal's lives.



Pumpkin (Now Keeva)

A cold afternoon in February our Humane Society Police Officers found this poor pup, Pumpkin in deplorable condition. Pumpkin was with Ruby, her mom. She was in decent condition, but Pumpkin needed emergency care. She ended up spending the first 4 days in our custody at the emergency room receiving multiple medications and fluid treatments. We still didn't know if she would make, but we could see the fight in her eyes. We knew we would do whatever it took to make her whole again. In that first month she made amazing progress and it wasn't long at all before she got adopted by a wonderful family. (And guess what? They ended up adopting her mom, Ruby, too!) Here she is 9 months after being saved. She was renamed to Keeva, which means beautiful, gentle protector. We cannot think of a better name for this beautiful girl!
